## PAIGH U.S. National Section Monthly Meeting – July Meeting Notes

Tuesday, July 8, 2025

### Welcome

- Deirdre welcomed everyone to the meeting and thanked members for their continued involvement in the USNS.
- 1) PAIGH Update Upcoming PAIGH Elections and Leadership Transitions
  - PAIGH will hold elections during the upcoming October General Assembly in Honduras.
  - The U.S. has traditionally held a leadership role in PAIGH. Recent representatives include Patricia Solis (current President), Jean Parcher, and Bruce Presgrave.
  - After consultation with the State Department, it was decided on June 6 that the U.S. would submit a nominee. The nomination deadline was June 10.
  - Deirdre has been nominated for Vice President of PAIGH. Her nomination has cleared the White House and the Department of State and is now being circulated to PAIGH Member States.
  - If elected, Deirdre will no longer be eligible to serve as President of the U.S. National Section. A successor will need to be identified, preferably someone in the U.S. government due to the role's liaison responsibilities.
  - Members interested in serving as U.S. National Section President are encouraged to reach out to Deirdre.
  - Evan Ward, current Vice President of the U.S. National Section, has stepped down temporarily. His departure creates a vacancy that must be filled.
  - There is no requirement for the Vice President to be a government employee—past Vice Presidents have come from academia and the private sector.
  - Members interested in the Vice President role are also encouraged to reach out to Deirdre.
- 2) U.S. National Section (USNS) Digital Archive and History Research

#### Overview:

- The USNS has been centralizing documentation in a digital Google Drive archive, with complete records from 2014 onward.
- Documents include meeting minutes, Technical Assistance Project records, annual reports, and General Assembly trip reports.
- Materials from an earlier hard drive archive have also been integrated.
- Records for 2012–2013 are partial; pre-2012 documentation is largely missing.

## • Recent Developments:

- During the 25th PAIGH General Assembly, Secretary General Campuzano offered archival research support.
- A formal request was submitted to locate historical artifacts about USNS; parallel U.S. research efforts also began.
- This work has gained urgency due to recent administrative changes and renewed questions about U.S. involvement in PAIGH.

### Research Initiative:

- Erick Langer and Paul Riley are leading a project to document U.S. contributions to PAIGH and develop a U.S. submission for PAIGH's Centennial Celebration.
- o Initial findings include materials at the Smithsonian National Anthropological Archives (24 boxes of historical PAIGH records from the Library of Congress).
- Artifacts date back to 1928, including founding documents, U.S. delegation records, and Commission materials.

## Key Historical Insights:

- PAIGH founded October 7, 1928 (Havana); inaugurated September 1929 (Mexico City).
- o U.S. was a founding member and key contributor.
- U.S. participation formalized via Joint Resolution 80 (August 2, 1935), signed by President Roosevelt.
- The 6th General Assembly (1955) marked PAIGH's integration into the Organization of American States and formalized National Sections.
- o Notable U.S. contributors include Dr. Arch C. Gerlach and others across history, geography, cartography, and geophysics.

## • Next Steps & Research Sources:

- Continued research at institutions including:
  - Department of State's Office of the Historian
  - Library of Congress
  - HathiTrust
  - American Geographical Society
  - PAIGH Archives in Mexico City

### Considerations:

- USNS may also consider recognizing its own centenary in conjunction with PAIGH's.
- The group will need to determine how best to safeguard and pass along its institutional history and digital archive to future leadership.

# 3) Upcoming 32<sup>nd</sup> International Cartographic Conference (ICC 2025)

- Tim Trainor shared that the next <u>International Cartographic Conference (ICC)</u> will take place in **Vancouver, Canada**, from **August 17–22, 2025**, marking a significant event hosted in the Americas.
- The conference theme is "Mapping the Future: Innovation, Inclusion, and Sustainability."

### Key Highlights:

- o Pre-conference workshops on August 17, reflecting the work of the 28 commissions.
- Daily keynote sessions, Monday through Friday.
- Technical sessions, poster presentations, sponsored talks, and both an international map exhibition and a children's map exhibition.

### Keynote Topics of Interest:

- Sustainability in the Arctic
- Mapping and Indigenous Communities
- o Environmental Justice
- Digital Earth and Digital Twin Technologies
- Geo-visualization and Earth Observations
- Volunteered Geographic Information (e.g., Humanitarian mapping initiatives)
- Geological and Historical Mapping
- o Artificial Intelligence and Emerging Mapping Technologies
